College of Arts and Sciences serves the majority of undergraduate students

this year: 630 new Freshmen

209 Transfer students

1640 Continuing students

20 Non-matriculated students

2499 total undergraduate students

Assumption: Transfer students will seamlessly fit into the traditional undergraduate population Realization: They don't.

Confounding (but good) issues:

A new president

Revived interest in curricular reform

Challenge to redefine ourselves while retaining our core values (a reflection of our Brethren heritage: community-diversity-inclusivity-values-respect for the world around us)

Strategic Planning

Reformation of the curriculum:

La Verne Experience (learning communities that capture theory-to-practice, experiential learning, integrated learning, reflection)

Defining Baccalaureate Goals

Redefining General Education (from distributive to ???)

Interdisciplinary curriculum

Co-curricular experience threaded across the curriculum

So what about the *transfer students*??

Goal: Integrate transfer students into the curricular reform *seamlessly*

Challenges:

Extending the La Verne Experience to transfer students

No additional time spent in their programs

No additional requirements placed on transfer students

Insure transfer students are integrated into community of undergraduate students

Establish learning communities within majors

Integrate transfer students into learning communities

Develop co-curricular opportunities within majors

Foster transfer-friendly environment within majors

Academic preparation of transfer students

Advising + articulation agreements + transfer courses

Making it happen. We've only just started and have miles to go before it is a reality.
